Join us as we welcome the return of all three of these amazing speakers for the first regional conference plenary outside of the Bay Area for Challenge Success, a research-based organization that grew out of the Stressed-Out Students (SOS) Project at Stanford University. Challenge Success offers curricula, conferences and other programs that present alternatives to the established notions of success in schools and families. With a focus on youth well-being, school reform, and scholarly research, Challenge Success has established itself as a significant force in the education sphere. They have chosen the New Trier Township area as their first locale, and are working with nearly a dozen school teams, consisting of school administrators, school counselors, parents and students on the two-day conference.

Dr. Ginsburg will keynote the evening plenary – you may remember him from his series of events in our area last November, where he achieved some of the highest audience approval numbers in FAN's history. He is a pediatrician specializing in Adolescent Medicine at The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine. Dr. Ginsburg also serves as Director of Health Services at Covenant House Pennsylvania, an agency that serves Philadelphia's homeless and marginalized youth. He is the author of Building Resilience in Children and Teens: Giving Kids Roots and Wings and Letting Go with Love and Confidence: Raising Responsible, Resilient, Self-Sufficient Teens in the 21st Century. Audiences were wowed last year by his articulate, compassionate, vigorous voice on the topic of resilience.

Joining Dr. Ginsburg on stage after his keynote will be Challenge Success Co-Founders **Denise Pope, Ph.D., Stanford University Senior Lecturer**, and author of *Doing School* and **Madeline Levine, Ph.D.**, clinical psychologist and *New York Times* best-selling author of *The Price of Privilege* and the brand-new *Teach Your Children Well*. They'll lead an interactive discussion about the meaning of success and how families and educators can help youth thrive in the fast-paced world in which we live.
